
Food Insecurity

25% of global disease burden, mostly infectious, but increasing NCD burden





African Research Initiative for Scientific Excellence Pilot Programme (ARISE-PP) | Call for Expressions of Interest


Are you a talented early-career scientist who has already produced excellent supervised work, is ready to work independently, and shows potential to be a research leader? This is an opportunity for you to further develop your research career and become a principal researcher leading your own grant.

ARISE grantees will be awarded grants of up to €500,000 to start their own independent research teams.



Application Submission Deadline: 30 July 2021











Overview of ARISE-PP

Main objective: to broaden and strengthen Africa's science base through open and direct continental competition for funding amongst the very best young African researchers with the aim of contributing to the transformation of Africa into a knowledge-based and innovation-led continent.

Specific objectives:

- 1. To enhance the capabilities of emerging African research leaders committed to a research and teaching career in Africa.
- 2. To strengthen institutional research management and support systems to enable pan-African research to thrive.
- 3. To support the generation of cutting-edge research in contribution to the transformation of Africa into a knowledge-based and innovation-led continent and towards the transformation of lives in African through science.



ARISE-PP grants: Highlights


- At least 40 emerging African research talents across 40 African countries.
- A call for proposals open to African researchers, in all areas of scientific endeavor.
 Proposals should take into account the priorities of the AU-EU High Level Policy Dialogue on Science, Technology and Innovation (Public Health, Green Transition, Innovation and Technology, Capacities for science), and most importantly demonstrate the capacity to deliver cutting-edge research in their chosen field of endeavor.
- The call for applications targets African researchers with 2 to 7 years of experience post-PhD but with considerable and demonstrable research leadership experience.
- Grant awards of up to EUR 500,000 over a period of up to 5 years to start their own independent research team and project.
- A Scientific Advisory Committee, composed of eminent African and European scientists, guarantees the scientific independence and aptness of the initiative.


